First information

WELCOME

The Latvian Skating Association and the Local Organizing Committee are looking forward to welcome the skating family in Riga for the Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Riga Cup 2017.

Information about Latvia

Geography

Latvia is the central country of the Baltic States (Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania) and is located in North-eastern Europe on the east coast of the Baltic Sea. Its geographic coordinates are 57°00'N latitude and 25°00'E longitude. It consists of fertile lowland plains and moderate hills, with most of its territory less than 100 meters above sea level. It has an extensive network of rivers, thousands of lakes and hundreds of kilometers of undeveloped seashore lined by pine forests, dunes, and continuous white sand beaches.

Location

Latvia is bordered by Estonia to the north, Russia to the east, Lithuania to the south and the Baltic Sea to the west. Its strategic location has made it an international crossroad for trade, commerce and cultural exchange since ancient times. Vikings followed the 'Amber Road' through Latvian territory along the Daugava River to reach Byzantium and the Mediterranean Sea.

Climate

Latvia's weather features a temperate maritime climate, with mild summers, moderate winters and frequently high levels of humidity and precipitation.

- Summer: June - September.

(Just a friendly reminder even august is a summer time event will be happening in an ice rink therefore don't forget about warmer closing)

- Winter: December - February.

- The average temperature:

In summer: 18.8°C (in the capital 20.1°C),

In winter: -14.5°C (in the capital -13.8°C).

- The warmest month: July,

- The coldest month: January.

Nature

With over 44 percent of its territory covered by forests, a vast network of free flowing rivers and thousands of lakes, Latvia is one of Europe's best preserved havens for a wide variety of wildlife. Over 27 thousand species of flora and fauna thrive in natural settings that are still relatively undisturbed by man. Many rare species, such as the black stork and lesser spotted eagle, make their homes in Latvia's mixed forests, marshes and meadows. There is also an abundance of otters, beavers, lynx and wolves, as well as great concentrations of deer, elk, fox and wild boar. Bird-watching is particularly rewarding in Latvia, especially in the coastal areas and wetlands during annual migration periods.

Population

Latvians are the indigenous people of Latvia, and the Finno-Ugric Livs (or Livonians) are the only indigenous minority. Latvia's present ethnic mix is largely a result of massive post-war immigration, which resulted in a decline in the share of ethnic Latvians from 77% in 1935 to 52% in 1989.

About Riga

Latvia's political, economic and culture centre is in Rīga, where more than one third of Latvia's population (650 thousand) lives and works. Rīga's elegant Old Town and distinctive Art Nouveau architecture serve as a stimulating setting for a vibrant modern business and cultural life. Founded in 1201, this former Hanseatic League member is one of the oldest medieval cities in Europe and has been listed by UNESCO as one of the world's most important cultural and natural sites. As one of the new stars of the dynamic Baltic Sea region, Rīga has hosted a NATO summit, world hockey championship, the Eurovision Song Contest and many other large-scale international events. Rīga's International Airport is one of the fastest growing travel hubs in Europe.

Riga was officially founded in 1201, just over eight hundred years ago, as German merchants came over to colonise the Baltics. By 1282 the city was granted admittance into the powerful Hanseatic trading league of predominantly German towns, allowing Riga to flourish. Since that time Riga has been a free town, part of the Polish-Lithuanian kingdom, part of the Swedish empire, part of the Russian empire and part of the USSR. This has always led to Riga being a cosmopolitan and ethnically diverse town.

Riga is in fact the largest city of the Baltic states, despite a relatively small population of 800,000. It has a large Old Town (Vecrīga), which stretches alongside the Daugava river, and boasts a number of historic monuments, the most striking of which are the Doms Cathedral and St. Peter's Church; whilst the area of Riga referred to locals simply as 'the centre' is famous for its Art Nouveau (Jugendstil) architecture. The Historic Centre of Riga as a whole is included on the UNESCO world heritage list.

Riga is also home to two of Latvia's largest academic institutions, the University of Latvia and Riga Technical University; it houses the Latvian parliament (Saeima); boasts the largest airport in the Baltics - Riga International Airport; and can claim the tallest building in the Baltics - the Riga Radio and TV Tower. Riga maintains sister relationships with cities around the world, including Moscow, Beijing, Dallas, Santiago, Stockholm, Florence...

TRAVELLING TO RIGA

BY PLANE

The official airport for the ISU Junior Grand Prix in Riga will be Riga International Airport (RIX).

The Organizing Committee provides a pick-up service at the Riga International Airport. **The fee for the pick-up service at Riga Airport is € 10.00 per person for round trip and need to be paid upon arrival at registration.** Please inform the Organizing Committee together with your entry whether you will be using the transportation offered.

Distance between airport and hotel - 8 km ; airport and icerink - 6 km
hotel **BELLEVue Park Hotel Riga** and icerink - 7 km

Pick-up times to the airport will be posted the day prior the departure.

"**VOLVO**" Sports Center opened its doors to visitors in 2005 August but the official opening was only in November 16th. Our hall is only hall in Latvia with two-standard indoor ice rinks, located between two housing estates Imanta and Zolitude.

Ice hall is open seven days a week from 6:30 am to midnight, ice hall offers various programs to the public, including public skating sessions, learn-to-skate classes and youth/adult hockey times.

In Hall we have a newly created professional oriented sports school "PARDAUGAVA".

Sports School enrol students in ice hockey and figure skating groups.

Two icerinks are under one roof, both icerinks are heated and air-conditioned.

Members, Technical Committee Members or Members of the Head Office of their Federation and a maximum of two medical persons. Accreditation will only be granted to persons in those various functions if officially entered and named through their National Association. The ISU Member certifies with the signed entry form the indicated functions within the team of all team members. Any misuse of any function will be sanctioned by the ISU/OC.

Accreditation will be given to appointed ISU Event Officials, ISU Office Holders and Guests of Honour

Passports of the skaters have to be presented at the accreditation for verification!

Most of the hotels, stores and restaurants accept Visa, MasterCard, Eurocard, Diner’s Club and American Express. However, it is advisable to carry some cash with you.

Banks are plentiful and easy to find in Riga. Most are open from 9:00 to 18:00 on weekdays, while some offices are also open on Saturday mornings. All banks offer currency exchange services. Exchange offices can also be found in larger hotels, the airport, harbour, railroad station and major shopping centres. ATM cash machines are available throughout the city.

ELECTRICITY

The electricity is **220 Volt** and most over-sea countries will need an adaptor to fit the plugs, which is **standardized two-point plug**.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Public buses, trolleys, and trams operate regularly from 6 a.m. to 12 p.m. You may purchase tickets ahead of time at newsstands across the city or via driver in each transport.
